Child Abuse Material Instrument (CAMI)

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

The Child Abuse Material Instrument (CAMI) was developed to assist probation officers in the assessment, supervision, and management of sexual offenders who were arrested on charges related to possession, receipt, and/or distribution of child pornography. The CAMI can be completed by the forensic examiner and/or used as a self-report instrument. The self-report responses could be compared to information gathered by the forensic investigator to determine the client's level of honesty and minimization.

For each question, the person completing the instrument should read each item and place a check mark in all boxes that apply. It is acceptable to use estimations. On questions 1, 2, 3, 8, 10 & 15, the person should also circle the one choice that represents the "most frequent." In the following example the offender traded material using his computer, cell phone, and cloud storage (indicated by check marks). The majority of the material was located on the computer (indicated by circled response).

DEFINITIONS

Child sexual abuse material is any material that could be deemed child pornography. This should include material that resulted in the criminal charge as well as any material that could have resulted in further criminal charges

Pornography is the representation in media of sexual poses or behaviors that are erotic or lewd and are designed to arouse sexual interest. This can include legal and non-illegal material.

SPECIFIC ITEM DIRECTIONS

Question 8. *Types of Pornographic Material* – This questions asks about pornography found in addition to child sexual abuse images. Use the following definitions to categorize any other pornography found.

- **BDSM:** Pornography involving consensual bondage, domination, sadism or masochism. (e.g., individuals bound, gagged, punished, humiliated, etc. during a sexual encounter)
- **RAPE:** Pornography involving force, violence or coercion. Non consensual sex.
- **Bestiality:** Pornography involving sexual acts between humans and animals.
- **Voyeurism:** Pornography involving the viewing of seemingly unsuspecting individuals, usually strangers, who are naked, in the process of disrobing, or engaged in sexual activity (e.g., locker room, bathroom, dormitory, etc.).
- **Self-Pics:** Sexually oriented photos or videos of the offender. For example pictures of their penis or of them masturbating.
- **Soft Core:** Soft Core pornography contains depictions of nude or semi-nude performers sometimes engaged in sexual activity (e.g., sexual intercourse, masturbation, etc.). Soft Core pornography typically does not contain explicit depictions of vaginal or anal penetration.

- **Hard Core:** Hard Core pornography contains depictions engaged in sexual activity where the focus is on some form of penetration.
- **Anime / Cartoon:** Pornography produced through the use of animation or computer generated imagery.
- **Barely 18:** Pornography involving performers who are allegedly over 18 years old but may appear young in age.
- **Incest:** Images related to sexual activity with a family member.

Question 10. *The COPINE Scale* is a system used to categorize child sexual abusive material. Use the definitions below to help determine the type of child sexual abuse material discovered. (Taylor, Max; Holland, G. Quayle, E. (2001). "Typology of Paedophile Picture Collections" (PDF). The Police Journal 74: 97–107.)

- **Indicative:** Non-erotic and non-sexualized pictures showing children in their underwear, swimming costumes from either commercial sources or family albums. Pictures of children playing in normal settings, in which the context or organization of pictures by the collector indicates inappropriateness.
- **Nudist:** Pictures of naked or semi-naked children in appropriate nudist settings, and from legitimate sources.
- **Erotica:** Surreptitiously taken photographs of children in play areas or other safe environments showing either underwear or varying degrees of nakedness.
- **Posing:** Deliberately posed pictures of children fully clothed, partially clothed or naked (where the amount, context and organization suggests sexual interest).
- **Erotic Posing:** Deliberately posed pictures of fully, partially clothed or naked children in sexualized or provocative poses.
- **Explicit Erotic Posing:** Pictures emphasizing genital areas, where the child is either naked, partially clothed or fully clothed.
- **Explicit Sexual Activity:** Pictures that depict touching, mutual and self-masturbation, oral sex and intercourse by a child, not involving an adult.
- **Assault:** Pictures of children being subject to a sexual assault, involving digital touching, involving an adult.
- **Gross Assault:** Grossly obscene pictures of sexual assault, involving penetrative sex, masturbation or oral sex, involving an adult.
- **Sadistic/ Bestiality:** Pictures showing a child being tied, bound, beaten, whipped or otherwise subject to something that implies pain or pictures where an animal is involved in some form of sexual behavior with a child.

Question 19. *Communication with Minors* - Communication includes texts, e-mails, chats, etc. with an individual under the age of 18 that could be construed as cruising (seeking victims) or grooming; sexually oriented or where there was the exchange of pornography; or of inappropriate or unusual content. Please indicate if minors were family, known individuals, or strangers.

USE OF DATA

Once completed, it is highly recommended that responses on the CAMI be shared between community supervision, treatment providers, polygraphers, and any other member of the containment/treatment team.
