

## Word Webs

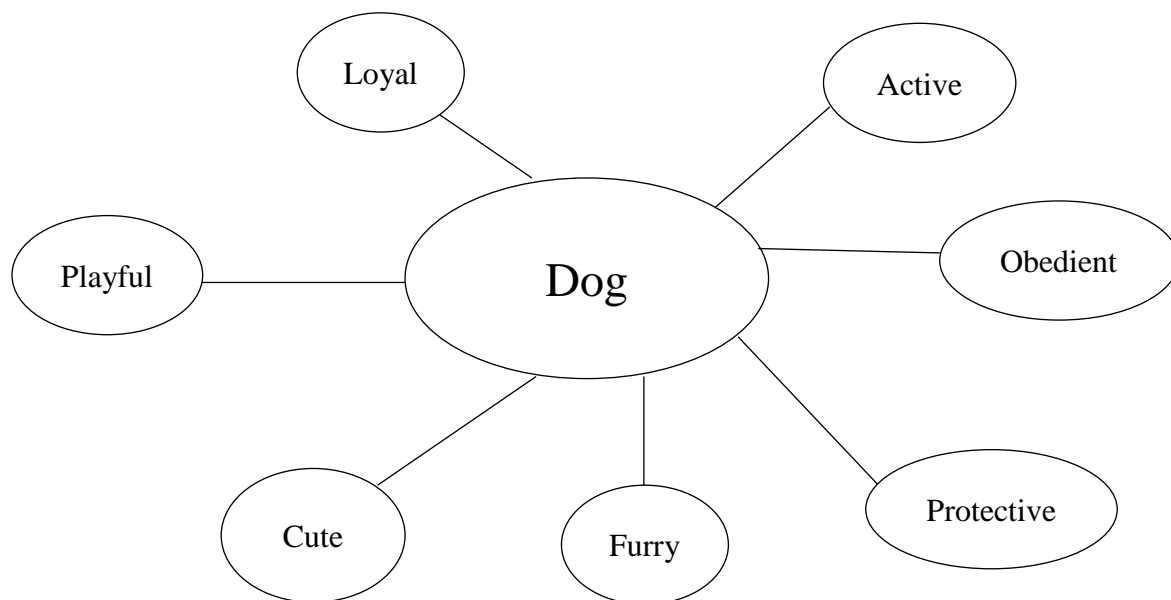
This activity can be done with an individual or as part of a treatment group.

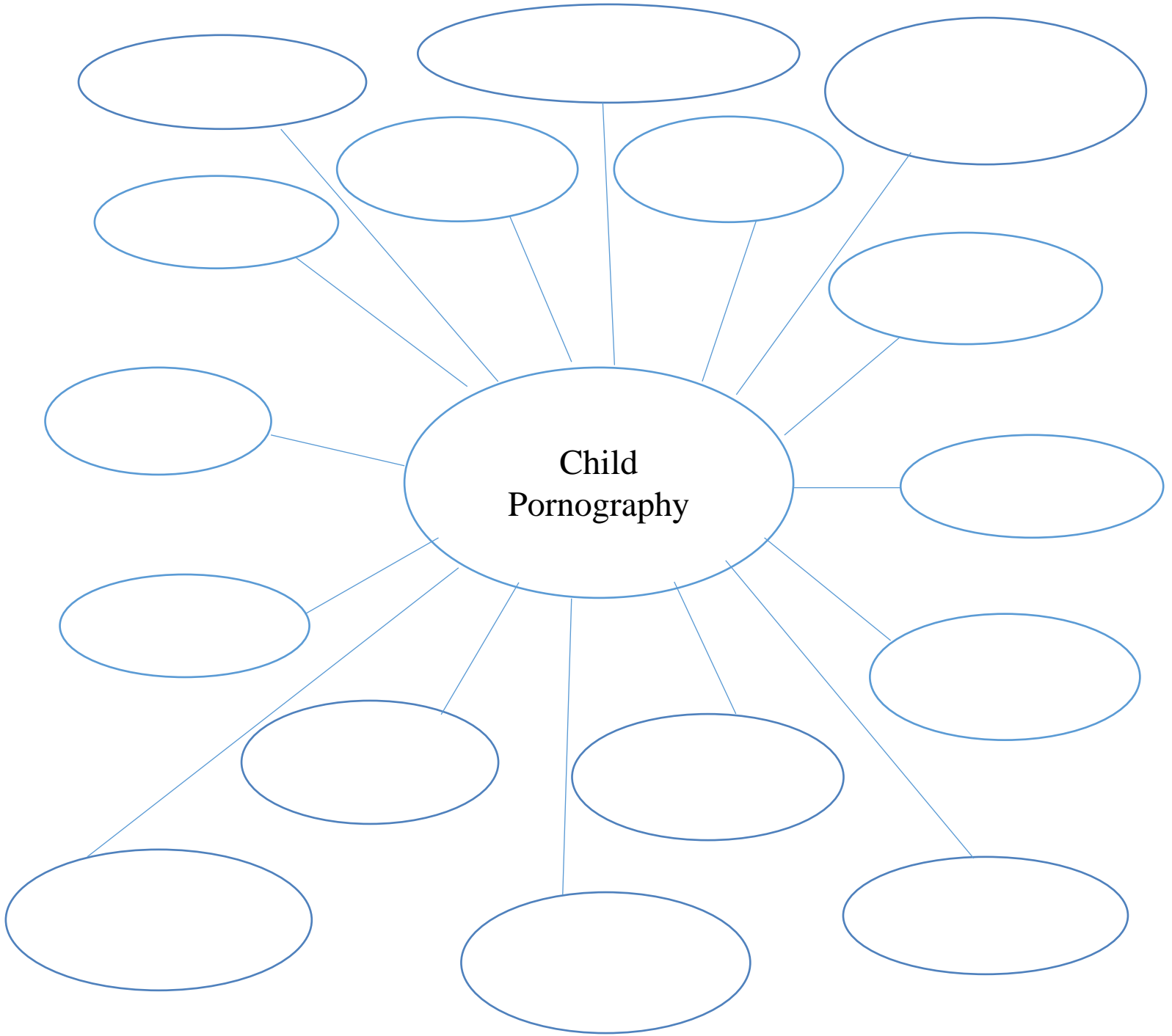
First, explain that a word web is a free association of words that are related to the foundation word listed in the center of the page. These can be any words (adjectives, verbs, nouns, adverbs, etc.) that come to mind when the client thinks about the foundation word. The example below can be used to assist clients in understanding how word webs are done.

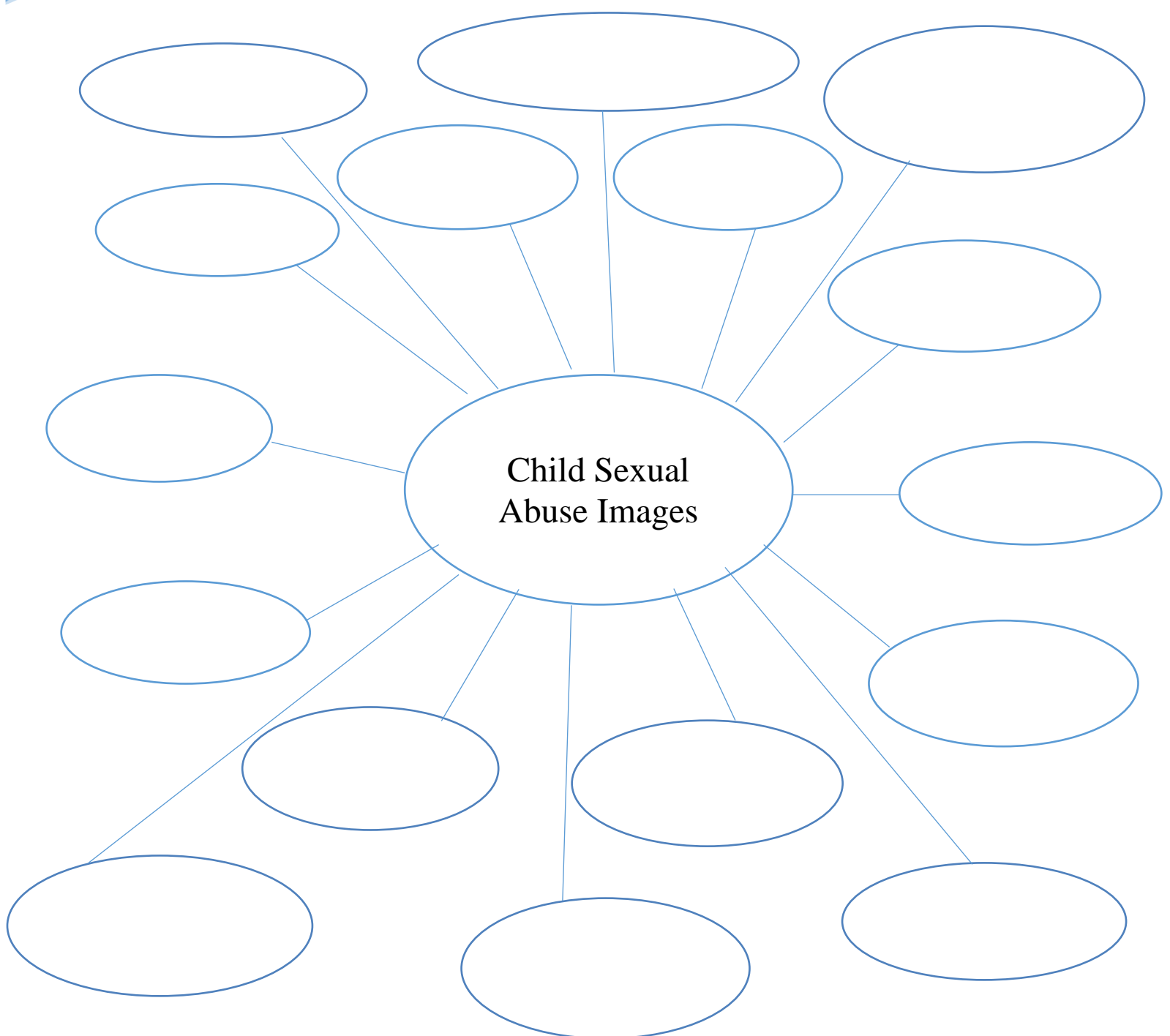
After the client(s) understand how to complete a word web, ask the client(s) to complete a word web using the words “child pornography” as the foundation.

Next, ask the client(s) to complete a word web using the words “child sexual abuse images” as the foundation.

Below are some “Food for Thought” questions for clients to consider.

1. Which word web caused a stronger emotional reaction?
2. What were some of the emotions you felt while completing the word webs?
3. What were some thoughts you had while completing the word webs?
4. Explain how you would define the difference between “child pornography” and “child sexual abuse images.”
5. Which term is more difficult for you to use and why?
6. Which term do you think is appropriate to use and why?
7. What other words or phrases help to minimize your online sexual offense behavior?
